It was the big task for us to keep 20 children quarantined from other children with all the safety and precautions but we managed to take care of them by following all the protocols and got all the children tested for Covid 19. Fortunately, all of the tests came back negative.



Regardless of this, the Karm Marg staffs always gives their best and leaves no stone unturned to provide the best for the children. A couple of staff members also fell sick while taking care of the children and they were also treated at KM. We are grateful that all of the children and staff members are doing well and are at their peak health.

Isolation is a big challenge for us as our campus structure does not allow for have this kind of separation; we have a common washroom, sleeping area but now we need separate isolation room with attach bath/washroom area.



In this difficult time of **Pandemic** we also tried our best to reach out to those local people who are really in need. We did rekey in our nearby community. We distributed dry ration to **122** Individuals and Helped **12** individuals financially. We are grateful to have positively affected the lives of **134** people.

We also reached out to some of KM alumni who lost their job and needed some financial support which was provided to them and also helped them get the job.

The COVID-19 pandemic has changed and will continue to change the world of the children of **Karm Marg**.

• Karm Marg makes a constant effort to engage and educate through different medium. This time we organized a puppet show for them through Ajit Bhatt from Katputli Colony, Delhi. They make puppet from waste materials and due to lockdown and Covid, their business had suffered. This way we also supported them.

The children thoroughly enjoyed this form of storytelling and the artist also told them how they make puppets out of waste material, like plastic bottles, waste clothes etc.

The STEM fellowship:

•STEM Fellowship is a program which led by Empower partner Feminist Approach to Technology (FAT). This workshop focused on developing high level cognitive and non-cognitive/transferable skill such as scientific thinking, problem solving and critical thinking which can be used across a range of occupational fields. Training and exposure was given towards non-traditional jobs for young women and adolescent girls.

The program is envisioned to up-skill trainers working with girls from marginalized communities to incorporate STEM (Science technology engineering Math's) learning and social aspects like gender in their programs. Through this fellowship the organization aims to create a pool of trained STEM trainers who are both proactive and inspiring in promoting STEM learning and careers for girls from a young age.





Two of our girls, Jyoti and Rani are participating in STEM fellowship Programme to become a trainer from the beginning of the quarter. They know the rights and responsibilities of a citizen, economic gap and decision making is effectively demonstrating their ability to think critically about these issues and to develop creative solutions and have a deeper understanding of these topics

- All the children and staff members went through the Covid-19 tests by Primary Health Centre in May.
- Young adults above 18 years of age had got their first dose of vaccine, which was organized by District child protection unit of Faridabad.
- Two of our staff members were found covid positive in the month of May, it was very challenging for all of us to manage the home as well as the staff but thankfully both recovered and doing well.

JUGAAD -OUR INCOME GENERATION WING:

Jugaad business started picking up at winter and spring time and we were hoping that things will change and will improve the business but suddenly second wave hit badly in mid-April things got worse and once again we saw the lockdown. This time Covid19 engulfed whole of India very badly.

We are back to zero once again but in June came new opportunities. We took some serious decisions to improve our business and take care of Jugaad. There is much movement where we thought of closing down the Jugaad but entire team want to give it one more chance.

In June, we partnered with Jugmug Thela to take over Jugaad shop (In Saket, Delhi) and take care of all the logistic and running of the shop, with this we manage to cut down the expenses of Jugaad. Now they given a totally new look to the shop and running it under new brand name Ekdam Local. Apart from Jugaad products, there are many more brands who are showcasing there product. We are hoping with this decision Jugaad sales will improve with time.

We also connected to our old buyer and start getting few orders. We got our first export order from Shared Earth – UK, after March 20 and first consignment dispatch in June end. We got two more orders from overseas one from Salearancio – Maria, Italy and Capsicum, Netherlands.

Our online sales at Gocoop started again and Itokri, an online shopping side given us a new order.





As Rakhi festival is approaching, keeping that in mind we designed new sets of Rakhi, made catalogue and started promoting it on social media site. We collaborated with Enactus to boost up sales through online platforms. Enactus, Hindu College, students from various disciplines are committed towards bringing a sustainable change in the society through innovation and entrepreneurial spirit.



They are collaborating with different Social enterprises and helping them. They designed our catalogue and helped to promote it on social media and also trying up different venues to sell Jugaad Rakhi.
