Each of those has been very engaging and challenging for our students in different ways while being fun-filled. We celebrated a few festivals such as Holi and Republic Day with joy and excitement. We also had a little excursion for the children while taking care of all safety measures and maintaining all precautions.

MAYOR CONDUCTS

• An escape to nature at pandemic time -Tanu Shree organized a 5 days excursion in the mountains for 22 children & staff. She runs a beautiful home stay by the name of" The Forest Edge" in Trithan valley, Himachal Pradesh. The trip was full of adventure, exploring and learning so many new things about nature. Biggest highlight for the children was to see the snow for first time in their life!! They had blast there. Apart from this, children participated in "Clean the Valley Drive" where they picked the plastic waste in surrounding areas and converted them into useful products. They organized a community library as well.







• Pi-Cycle Online Camp - Aavishkaarorganization organized an online winter camp called Pi-Cycle. It was a 5 days long workshop which commenced on 04th January 2021. Sidharth and Abhishek from KM participated in this workshop and got the opportunity to interact with children from other NGOs. The aim was to make. Maths, more accessible and understandable. They learned and focused on understanding the fraction numbers, visualization of numbers, learnt about different patterns and tried to engage them mathematically. They also made the students solve a lot of math's based puzzles. Their basic concepts have become stronger and this is helping them in solving complex problems more easily.

- EMpowerLeader Lab Rani participated in 3-months long virtual training program organized by EMpower India called EMpower Leader Lab Introductory. She was among the 25 other female participants from different NGO. This training program was specifically designed for girls to gain first-hand experience of participatory action research. It was a blended learning program, mixing online master classes with onthe ground research. The training offers experience-based and collaborative learning where they will also reach out to adolescent girls in their communities to identify:
- What are the barriers that adolescent girls are currently facing as a consequence of COVID19?
- What actionable recommendations do they have to address these barriers?
- What advice do they have for policy makers / practitioners who are working to build inclusive cities?

She was asked to show a visual representation of how she interviewed them and she chose to do so by drawing. She made a beautiful sketch and showed it to them. She was also a part of data analysis lab participated in activities where they analyzed the forms of each and every girl one by one.





It is so important for our members to keep involving themselves in activities which broaden their horizons and help them teach the students and their peers same.

Art Reach Fellowship - Art Reach India program Teaching fellowship which starts in Nov 20 is in full swing. 12 Children are part of this workshop. Lokesh Khodke a teaching fellow making them understands how to sketch and write short story.





They are exploring how to convert an empty matchbox in to story book. Most of their story based on surrounding KM and children interaction with nature, their pets and other bird animal live in KM. Children are enjoying this creative outlet that has been given to them and are making complete and thorough use of it. Apart from this other medium also used for story telling like leaves and water color.

• INVOLVE Program - A learning solutions foundation that believes that by giving some ownership of learning to students themselves, by building voice, choice and skills in them, it can solve the lack of student preparedness for the future and the excessive dependence of the learning system on teachers. The Involve programme is based on peer to peer learning and focuses on students teaching students. Our student leaders, Sidharth, Abhishek and Nargish received 5 days of training which started on 18th February.





In this learning they learnt how to teach and interact with the learners and how to better handle situations that could go on in a classroom. They were also taught some tips and tricks on how to make the class interesting and really get all the benefits of being a student leader. After they had completed their own training they taught four juniors each. • Gender–Stem Fellowship - Pooja, Rani and Jyoti participated in this fellowship programme. This program is funded by Empower and lead by FAT(Feminist Approach to Technology).

This workshop focused on developing high level cognitive and non-cognitive/ transferable skill such as scientific thinking, problem solving and critical thinking which can be used across a range of occupational fields. Training and exposure was given towards non-traditional jobs for young women and adolescent girls. It started in March 21 and will continue for a year.





Girls found this workshop very interesting and engaging as they got chance to tell their stories and talk about their dilemmas which made them more confident. They are looking forward to the next workshop.

ABOUT JUGAAD -OUR INCOME GENERATION PROGRAMME

- Our sales at Jugaad were on an all-time low during first three quarters and for a while after that. But with the start of January sales have been picked up and we have received a few orders.
- We participated at KalaGhoda Arts Festival 2021 virtually which was held in February. Jugaad showcased their products and made a few sales.
- We also received orders from e-commerce websites such as Amazon, Itokriand Gocoop
- Our Jugaad shop located in Saket, New Delhi did moderate business

Due to current pandemic, **Jugaad** has very less work, so the Jugaad team decided to use this timeforengaging children in creative skills as they are not going to school and have plenty of time to explore new learning and skills. We at KM are blessed with a huge campus but still the children are worn down because of the lock down. They feel stuck in their routine and are longing for a change. These workshop engaged children a lot and they did not feel so bored to be at home full time.

• Pradeep conducted a carpentry workshop under Jugaad. 21 young adults participated in it. They were taught how to make cloth hangers and chopping boards. The students were quick to learn and loved participating in such a hands on experience.





• An embroidery session was held by Tara and Aarti for the children. Tara is a KM alumni and now has become a warden and Aarti is a young adult of KM. Adolescent children participated in this workshop. They were taught how to make easy embroidery patterns on handkerchiefs. They enjoyed the workshop fully. Especially the boys who had so much fun and showed interest in this workshop.

- Rakesh once again set out to teach 20 children of Karmmarg another fun and useful skill. This time they choose to make beautiful jewellery by kitepapers and paper quilling. The children were completely engrossed with learning such a beautiful skill and were very proud of what they had made.
- Rakesh has been teaching the children a lot of different things. He taught them all about how solar panels work and the importance of it in today's era. He also taught them how to make beautiful home décor with coke bottle covers. The children love these types of different activities and are very keen to learn new things.







PROBLEMS COME WITH A SOLUTION

Mosquitoes have always been a problem in KM, so to get rid of them we started makingCow-dung cake (Cakes of cow dung molded by bare hands with a curvature to be able to keep stuck to the walls.) with neem leaves and lemongrass to burn it in the evening time in outdoors, to keep mosquitoes away. It was so much fun when children started making mosquitoes repellents out of cow dung. Some of them easily tried their hands in making it, while some felt it gross because of the cowdung.
